PART 1 – JOB DESCRIPTION

1. JOB OVERVIEW

To build the effectiveness of Tearfund's staff and partners in the East Africa Region (South Sudan, Ethiopia, Somaliland, Kenya) in cash transfer programmes (CTP) and support country offices in leading on contingency planning. The role is responsible for providing technical support to Tearfund's response to the East Africa Crisis in the area of CTP as well as providing advice, support and assistance to country offices to develop contingency plans. Support the country teams with reporting and drafting of proposals to ensure technical standards are adhered to. The role will also contribute towards raising Tearfund's profile in CTP in the region, rolling out CTP operational procedures and guidelines, supported by the global Cash Adviser, and strengthening accountability, monitoring and learning across the region. Support may be provided in both operational programmes and advising partner organisations as appropriate.

2. ORGANIZATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

- The post-holder will, at all times, carry out their responsibilities with the utmost respect for the protection of children in accordance with Tearfund's Safeguarding Policy.

 - To pursue and maintain a Christian faith through ongoing personal spiritual development and a relationship with God.
 - To provide support and spiritual encouragement to staff and colleagues, in line with biblical principles.



• The post-holder will be expected to behave in accordance with Tearfund's 'Code of Conduct' as referred to in the Personal Conduct Policy.

3. KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

PROGRAMME STRATEGY

- Provide CTP and contingency planning input to inform the regional East Africa Response strategy.
- Monitor the humanitarian situation and potential future scenarios with respect to CTP, contributing to detailed reports and analysis, recommending appropriate CTP-related responses.
- Ensure CTP best practices and Tearfund's purpose, values, and the programme objectives are communicated effectively with all stakeholders (Tearfund and Partners).
- Through engagement in regional and national clusters and working groups, monitor further trends in CTP service delivery across the region.

PROJECT / SUPPORT FUNCTION MANAGEMENT

Support of ongoing CT programmes

- Coordinate directly with the Tearfund global technical team and global cash adviser, on sector specific guidance for CTP as appropriate and ensure Tearfund templates are used and disseminated in field.
- Support the implementation of project sector activities to achieve project goals and objectives including monitoring and mid term reviews in accordance with Tearfund and donor requirements.
- Gap fill for cash project managers as needed, collaborating closely with Country Representatives/Directors.
- Responsible for ensuring implementation of activities to Tearfund Quality Standards and in line with CTP technical good practice
- Support the use/development of appropriate and contextualised CTP methodologies, resources and materials, by the project team.
- Responsible for CTP related MEAL Support including:
 - Inputting into baselines, monitoring systems (including post distribution monitoring) and end of
 project surveys to ensure evidence is available to demonstrate project achievement of outputs
 and impact.
 - Actively promote the capturing of learning from the partner projects by country and partners staff and ensures that learning is shared and used effectively in the region and organisation as well as embedded in future project design.
 - Participate in project evaluations and assist in the analysis of results carry out monitoring visits.
 - Responsible to regularly collect regular stories and case studies to be used in Tearfund's internal and external communications as agreed in the Appeal Communications strategy.

Development of new CT programmes

- Assist with the development and writing of project proposals for donors, including developing budgets.
- In collaboration with relevant stakeholders, undertake detailed needs and market assessment and analysis, and design appropriate project interventions to meet needs and strengthen local capacities
- For emergencies, in new areas lead or support the project design and start up. Where possible this will be through 'on the job' capacity building of partners or operational staff to build longer term in country capacity.

CORPORATE POLICY AND COMPLIANCE

• Responsible for ensuring compliance to all corporate procedures and policies related to CTP (See Tearfund's cash operating manual and Logistics manual)



CONTINGENCY PLANNING

- Analyse existing contingency plans in Ethiopia, South Sudan, Kenya and Somaliland.
- Work closely with UK based contingency lead in UK Humanitarian Support Team to ensure consistency with contingency planning across the organisation globally.
- Lead, in close collaboration with country representatives, on contingency planning workshops at national level.
- Support country teams in identifying hazards and developing response plans as well as a set list of preparedness actions.
- Support monitoring of early warning indicators.
- Support Country representatives in ownership and monitoring of contingency plans going forward.
- Support key staff and partners through capacity building on CTP in areas where gaps exist.

CAPACITY BUILDING AND TEAM MANAGEMENT

- Provide or facilitate technical capacity building of colleagues and partners, such as mentoring, advice, support, accompaniment and training.
- Facilitate effective and innovative learning on CTP within Tearfund, between teams, and partners in collaboration with Global Cash advisor and Programme Coordinator.
- Participate in knowledge and information sharing within the programme and in Tearfund in general.
- In close collaboration with the Country Leads, manage the cash teams in the absence of cash programme managers providing supervision, guidance and monitoring for project staff, ensuring clarity over project plans and priorities and encouraging effective team-work.
- Support and coordinate learning between partners in region to support improved quality.

EXTERNAL REPRESENTATION

- Ensure Tearfund's representation and active participation at regional, national, district and local coordination meetings on CTP, and all relevant Cash Working Group meetings in region.
- Build positive local working relationships with partners, local communities, district government officials, UN, NGOs and where appropriate, donor representatives.
